

FIELD INSTRUCTION

The **typical** scenarios for enrolling in Field Instruction Winter term 2010 are listed below (this does not include approved Out-of-Sequence schedules)

NOTE: If you enrolled in SW 515 for only 1 credit hour Fall term 2009, see below heading, 'For students registered in SW 515 for only 1 credit hour in Fall 2009', for correct enrollment information.

16-month track (not Geriatric Scholars or Int'l/Nat'l Field students-see below):

16-month students in Field the equivalent of 2 full days per week enroll as follows:
Foundation Field Instruction SW 515-2 credit hours
Foundation Field Seminar SW 531-1 credit hour

16-month students in Field the equivalent of 3 full days per week enroll as follows:
Foundation Field Instruction SW 515-2 credit hours
Foundation Field Seminar SW 531-1 credit hour
Advanced Field Instruction SW 691-2 credit hours

20-month track:

20-month students in Field the equivalent of 2 full days per week enroll as follows:
Advanced Field Instruction SW 691-4 credit hours

20-month students in Field the equivalent of 3 full days per week enroll as follows:
Advanced Field Instruction SW 691-6 credit hours

Advanced Standing:

Advanced Standing students or students with an exemption from Foundation Field who are in Field the equivalent of 2 full days per week enroll as follows:
Advanced Field Instruction SW 691-4 credit hours

Advanced Standing students or students with an exemption from Foundation Field who are in Field the equivalent of 3 full days per week enroll as follows:
Advanced Field Instruction SW 691-6 credit hours

For students registered in SW 515 for only 1 credit hour in Fall 2009:

Note to students enrolling in SW 515/531: Under no circumstances can you enroll in 515 for more than 2 credit hours or in 531 for more than 1 credit hour. Any additional credit hours you may be required to register for must be enrolled under SW 691.
